As the host of over 50 hours of prime-time, award-winning documentary content for History, Discovery, National Geographic, Smithsonian Institution, and NASA, Josh has traced the Ark of the Covenant from the caverns of Jerusalem to the mountains of Ethiopia, communed with tribal chiefs in the most remote jungles of the Amazon Rainforest, and has hunted with alleged cannibals by moonlight in the forests of Papua New Guinea. In 2013, Josh sold BOSS and moved to Washington, DC to work with the Smithsonian Institution on a new STEAM education initiative with grants from the Smithsonian, the Department of Education, the Bezos Family Foundation, and others. The success of Josh's work with the Smithsonian led to the opportunity to create two additional STEM programs for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA): Project lanos with the Aldrin Family Foundation in 2021-2022 and Students To Launch with the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) in 2022-2023. All of these STEAM initiatives used best-in-class methodologies to help the students of today prepare to face and solve the challenges of tomorrow.
